DIRECTOR'S MEETING

Call to order at 10:12 am.

Approval of minutes for the fall meeting: Motion to approve by Dan Lilla, Second by Mike Fonger. It was noted that Bill Wilberg's name was spelled incorrectly. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report: Greg Dunlop was absent, but provided a report that was presented by President Dry. Motion by Dave Lewis; second by Dave Carlson to accept the treasurer's report. Motion passed.

USCA Directors reports:

Mark Swandby

Mark reported on the number of curlers in the US as 16,830, with 83 dedicated curling clubs. He reported that the United States and Canada have renewed and will continue the World Curling partnership. This means the two countries will continue to alternate the men's and women's World Championships. He announced the Continental Cup will be held in Las Vegas this fall, and the USCA will play host to the World Curling Federation in Reno, NV September of 2014. His report, along with the other Directors, was cut short due to our meeting being held before the USCA meeting, which will be held the weekend of April 24th in Minneapolis, MN.

Dave Carlson

Dave reported on three issues. First, the revised vision statement with the changes related to the governance task force of the USCA. He went over the significant changes and took questions to address each member's concern. The guiding principles revisions were sent to each club director and club Presidents, along with the flow chart, outlining the changes prior to the meeting. Second, he reported on the Digital agreement between the USOC and the USCA. And finally, he gave a brief update on the Revenue and Development committee of which he chairs. He pointed out the significance of the certification of voting rights due to the number of curlers in Wisconsin and the upcoming member's assembly.

Rich Lepping

Rich reported on his work with Governance task force, the finance committee, annual appeals, and the Dar Curtis Fund. It was pointed out that the finance committee will be presenting a dues increase for the 2014 season, and will discuss the funding of an annual appeals/planned giving position at the USCA.

Richard Maskel

Richard reported that the athletes support the proposed changes to the governance structure, and said it was long overdue. He thanked the WSCA for its support of him, and that his term has expired as an athlete's representative.

President's report

President Dry reported on the State governance task force committee and presented its finding and recommendations. He again asked for Hall of Fame and Volunteer of the year nominations, and asked that they be forwarded on to the USCA office/member services. He thanked directors for their support and work though out the year.

To give direction to our State Directors to approve the Vision Statement of the Governance Task Force as Presented. Motion passed.

Committee reports

Website; Mark Hartman was absent. He previously prepared a report that was read by Secretary Lepping. (See attached)

It was suggested to have a blog/chat/Skype area on our website. This would give the clubs an opportunity to talks about best practices. Ice maintenance, club services, membership programs, etc.. We would like Mark to look into this and report back at our fall meeting. Nicole Jahnke will also work with Mark, and suggest ways to improve our state website.

Aaron Richards reported the Men's and Women's State Championship was held in Appleton. He thanked Jim O'Neill for his clubs help and support. The Olson Rink from Blackhawk won the men's and the Karst Rink from Madison won the women's. The Olson Rink went on to place 2nd in the Club Nationals. Rice Lake will host the Men's and Women's State play downs in 2014.

High School:

it was reported by Jason Smith that the High School Bonspiel has potential conflicts with dates and will be worked out between Waupaca and Wausau. The dates discussed are February 14th and 15th.

Old Business:

Election of the USCA Director:

Nomination of the Wisconsin Director to the USCA is Dave Carlson. Having no nominations from the floor, a motion was made to close the nominations by Bill Wilberg, and second from Dave Lewis. Motion passed. President Dry then announced Mr. Carlson was elected unanimously. After the election, President Dry thanked Dave for his work on the USCA and work on rewriting the proposed by-laws.

New Business:

Jeremy Roe presented the 2013/14 state bonspiel calendar. Please work with your clubs to iron out any potential problems, and respond to Jeremy ASAP with any changes. (See attached) In addition, Rich Lepping will prepare and send out an updated calendar to post in all the clubs this fall.

A motion to support the 20% athlete rule, consistent with the revised governance changes was made by Dave Carlson, second by Jim O'Neill. Motion passed.

A motion to support the new proposed guiding principles in support of the new governance policies and by-law changes for the USCA was made by Jim O'Neill, second by Tony Jacobson. Motion passed.

Next Date: It was suggested that Wausau will hold the fall meeting, with a date to be determined after the Spring USCA meeting. Arlington will host if the Wausau club is not complete. The WSCA Secretary will send out the notice as soon as it becomes available.

Membership numbers - 541 (including all categories except junior curlers), up from 537 last year.

Renovated the clubhouse - Over \$60,000 to polish concrete, partially carpet with tiles, 6 large clubroom tables and 55 chairs, 2 barheight tables and 8 barheight stools

Plaques and Trophies - Nearly completed the updating, most of them were decades behind

Recruitment Efforts - Conducted 3 separate 2-session Learn2Curl courses. Cost was \$40. 102 participants, raising over \$4,000 for the club.

Wheelchair Curling - Again served as the national trials and training site for the National Team, which placed 4th at Worlds. Skipped by MCC member Patrick McDonald.

Junior Curling - 32 participants a high for recent years

Technology and Publicity - Increased our Facebook presence, improved our recruiting mailing list and internal member directory website

Debt Payment - Made a \$50,000 payment on our outstanding building debt, \$20k came from junior nationals profits and the rest from our Take Out the Loan campaign. We now seem to be very close to being able to pay off our building loan debt in 2016

Bonspiel guidelines and standardized bonspiel reports - approved these and are requiring them of all bonspiel chairs

Rental activity - Moratorium on large (full icehouse and clubhouse rentals) due to wear and tear, shifting toward "expo"-type events in the icehouse and smaller clubhouse rentals for the summer. Winter curling rentals continue to flourish, though it is time-consuming for coordinators and volunteers.

New scraper - Board recently approved the purchase of a new scraper

Marshfield Curling Club Report

The Marshfield Curling Club's membership for adult league play remained nearly identical to last season. League play consisted of Sunday, Monday (Competitive League), Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday.

Highlights of the season:

- MCC hosted the Marshfield Dairyfest Bar the first weekend of June for the first time and was very successful due to the direction of club & board member Jim Freund. Excellent fund raiser for the club and we will host the bar again this June.
- MCC's beer garden at the Central Wisconsin Fair also had its best year fund raising ever due to switching from tap to canned beer.
- 14 teams attended our Men's Spiel in January (moved from February so it wouldn't compete with Wausau's Men's Spiel). Sixteen (16) teams attended our mixed Lobstein Spiel in March.
- The junior program continues to grow, and our girls and boys high school teams had very successful seasons under the direction of Coach Mike Behling.

Future Projects:

- New lighting will be installed in the ice area this June.
- Plans are being made for renovating and improving the club kitchen area.

Hi Rich,

The Milwaukee Curling Club has completed the first year in its new facility on the Ozaukee County Fairground in Cedarburg, WI. The new 5-sheet facility is everything we ever could have asked for. Both the ice and club areas exceeded our wildest expectations, and the energy and enthusiasm around the club are unlike anything I've experienced in my 10 years as a member.

We had tremendous success with our Open House and Learn to Curl programs and added approximately 60 new members. We expect this number to continue to grow as more people in the community hear about our club from their friends, neighbors, and co-workers.

Our two long-standing bonspiels, the Kiltie Mixed Bonspiel and Milwaukee Men's Bonspiel were both filled to 32 teams for the first time in a number of years, and we are considering expanding the draw sheet if there is sufficient demand. Furthermore, our men's bonspiel turned a significant profit, which was unheard of back in the Ozaukee Country Club days.

Our operating expenses came in pretty much on budget, so we do not anticipate any increase in dues in the coming year. This was an unknown, so we're happy about the news. As membership continues to grow, we expect to be able to lower dues.

Beyond continuing to recruit new members, we are working to find appropriate ways to incorporate new curlers into our existing leagues without compromising the quality of play. If other clubs have had great success in this area, we would be happy to listen to any suggestions.

Finally, our new ice has only highlighted the need for new rocks. There is no longer any doubt that our rocks are tired and cannot produce the kind of speed and curl that we know the ice is capable of. Given the past several years of fundraising, a club-financed effort is not feasible. Some sort of "Buy a Rock" private campaign is most likely. We have looked at everything from purchasing three sets of the old North Shore rocks from Steve's Curling Supplies and then buying two reconditioned sets with similar characteristics from Canada Curling Stones, to five sets of reconditioned rocks from Canada Curling Stones, to five brand new sets. There is considerable debate over what amounts might be doable, what makes the most sense (temporary solutions vs. long-term). Again, if other clubs have thoughts or experiences to share, or if anybody knows of options we are not considering (available funds, sets for sale, etc...), we would be happy to hear them.

In summary, we have had a wonderful first year in the new club and would love to see everybody at our bonspiels and playdown events in the the future.

Unfortunately I will not be able to make the meeting today. I just got home from a business trip late last night.

Here is an update on the 2012-2013 season at the Stevens Point Curling Club.

2012-2013 Season

- Received our 501c3 status in Oct 2012 and got our sales tx exemption in Dec 2012
- Purchased a new RinkMaster Ultra2 scraper from Thompson Curling Supplies
- Ice preparation at the beginning of the season was finished on Oct 20, 2012.
- We held 2 Open Houses/Learn to Curl events on Oct 27 and Oct 27, 2012
- Leagues started the first week of November 2012.
 - Newly established open league on Monday evening – 6 teams
 - Open league on Tuesday evening – 10 teams
 - Women's league on Wednesday evening – 4 teams
 - Men's league on Thursday evening – 10 teams
 - Couples league on Friday evening with – 12 couples
 - UWSP Intramural league on Sunday evening with 8 teams
- Youth curling (elementary and middle school) curled on Sunday afternoon – 20-28 children.
- High school curling played on Mon, Tues and Thurs afternoons from 4-6pm
- The *inaugural* SPCC Women's Bonspiel was held on Feb 9-10, 2013 with 8 teams
- The Howard Woodside Memorial Men's Bonspiel was held on Mar 8-10, 2013 with 16 teams
- The SPCC Mixed Bonspiel was held on Mar 22-24, 2013 with 12 teams.
- The reverse raffle was a successful fund raiser (\$25 tickets, 300 tickets, \$1200 top prize)
- A new control strategy was successfully implemented to control ice surface temperature (using an IR temperature sensor), instead of brine temperature.
 - Efforts to optimize the controls are ongoing.

Rich,

I am not sure if Howie Fisher will attend for us or not, I was asked to fill in today but could not make it. We have had a long-time curler die this week and the visitation is today. I will supply a brief report in case Howie does not make the meeting.

We have completed a very successful 2012-13 season. We were able to begin curling in the first week of December after some construction related delays. We began the season with about 125 rookie curlers! That brings our membership up to appx. 450 and growing. Demand was strong and I feel it is still strong riding the wave of attention we were given by the local media (TV news and newspaper) and a strong social media presence (Facebook and Twitter). In addition, the fact that next year is an olympic year bodes well.

Our bonspiels were all successful and each had both more participants and generated more revenue for the club. Our men's had 72 teams all but maybe 5 from out of town--it was by far the biggest and most successful. Our Silver Spoon, Highlanders and Badger State were all profitable and had more participants as well. With our larger capacity and capability for summer ice (our experiment at seasons end of melting half of our ice from 8 sheets down to 4 worked well) our opportunities are wide open for adding another spiel to our mix.

We are very excited to host the US Senior Men's Curling Association National Championship next March. We have a Chairman in place, Perry Grueber and are ready to hit the ground running.

We are still working to complete our facility over the summer and therefore we are still in a fundraising mode as well. Summer goals are to complete the clubroom, add lockers and seating, and other finishing tasks.

Proposed WSCA Bylaw Changes
First presented September 29, 2012
Voted on April 20, 2013

Article III Section 2. Meetings and Elections.

Proposed new sentence at end of first paragraph would read: "No person shall be a voting representative for more than one club."

Article III Section 2. Meetings and Elections.

Proposed new 3rd paragraph would read: "There shall be no voting by proxy at a meeting of the membership nor at a meeting of the Board of Directors."

Article III Section 3. Officers.

Now reads: ". . . Each officer shall be a voting member of the board, including the case where the officer's member club is also represented by a duly qualified representative who is also entitled to vote. . . ."

Proposed amendment would read: ". . . Each officer shall be a voting member of the the Board of Directors. The officer's home club shall be entitled to have another voting director on the Board, provided that no person shall be entitled to more than one vote on the Board, even if a person represents more than one club. . . ."

Minutes of WSCA Committee Teleconference to Review the Guidelines for New USCA Bylaws

Teleconference held 8 Jan., 2013 Noon to 1:00 CST

Participants: Michael Dry, David Carlson, David Lewis, David Russell, Mark Olson

Discussion about composition of the Board of Directors:

It was accepted that there was no practical way for there to be representation for each region or combination of regions exactly proportional to the number of curlers, but the eleven regional directors as specified in Jim Pleasant's message (Wisconsin: 2 directors; GNCC: 2 directors; Minnesota: 2 directors; Great Lakes/Illinois: 1 director; MOPAC: 1 director; North & South Dakota: 1 director; Washington/Alaska: 1 director; Colorado/Nebraska/At Large: 1 director) was generally agreed to. It was also agreed that some sort of mechanism must be spelled out to periodically change the allocation of board members by region/combination of regions based on changing membership levels.

It was agreed and understood that, based on a board size of twenty members; four would be from the athletes to comply with the requirements for an Olympic Sport National Governing Body imposed by the Ted Stevens Olympic and Amateur Sports Act.

Regarding the remaining five board members, it was agreed that considering the parallel history, interests and efforts of the United States Women's Curling Association, they should select one of the five. Of the remaining four, it was the consensus of the committee that they should be divided equally as two members elected at-large by the Members Assembly and two members elected by the board.

It was discussed that the Members Assembly should choose the nominating committee to nominate candidates for the Members Assembly elected board members.

Discussion about running of the Members Assembly Meeting:

Due to the logistics of organizing and running the Members Assembly Meeting, we could not come up with a better method than to have the CEO run the meeting. However, it was stressed that the impetus for decisions of this body should originate with the body itself and not with the USCA Board or professional staff. There were no details about how this was to be accomplished, but agreement that this separation should be maintained despite the CEO conducting the meeting.

Playing In:

There was consensus that the current proposal that the bylaws contain a provision to allow athletes to form their own teams and be provided the opportunity to compete on the ice for the opportunity to represent the United States in international competition was necessary and in keeping with the traditions of our sport. It was also generally agreed that the lack of such a provision led to much of the opposition to the previous bylaws proposal.

Regions:

There was some discussion about the role of the regional organizations like WSCA. The region would vote on behalf of any curlers whose club did not send a representative. Further, the regional meeting continues to provide a channel for communication between the clubs at a closer level than the USCA.
